- Discussion includes: Insurance will not cover because the tree damage did not hit any of our camp owned by Camp Delton Club.
- Total transfer amount is \$24,500 which would leave \$10,000 in the tree removal budget. The \$10,000 would be budgeted to remove centrally located camp owned trees in the future, work orders would not be addressed in the spring.
- Tree service may be able to come back in the fall to address work orders.
